Major Milestones - FY11

FY-11 marked the implementation of the Threat Based Resource Model (TBRM). The TBRM accurately provides a meaningful basis for advanced planning, strategy, and decision making.

Law Enforcement Support

Analysis, aerial and ground support resulted in the seizure of \$18.5 Billion worth of drugs, property, weapons and cash in FY-11.

Aviation

23,776.25 hours flown supporting federal, state, and local law enforcement in Counterdrug missions in FY-11. Installation of the new Mission Equipment Packager for the UH-72A Lakota helicopter began in FY-11.

Civil Operations

The Drug Demand Reduction Program transitioned to Civil Operations.

Training

Five Counterdrug training centers (FL, IA, MS, PA, WA) provided training to:

OVERVIEW

The National Guard Counterdrug Program provides resources, expertise, and mission support to government agencies and community based organizations to support the overall mission of reducing drug use through detection, interdiction, disruption and curtailment.

Law Enforcement Support

Assist Federal, State, local and tribal agencies in disruption of illicit drug financing, production, transportation and distribution.

Aviation

Provide law enforcement agencies with aerial observation, photo imagery and communication support

Civil Operations

Civil Operations specialist's strategic support helps create a foundation for coalitions working to prevent substance abuse. National Guard efforts help increase awareness and create synergy within local communities to protect the nation's youth and motivate them to make a commitment to be drug free.

Training

Provide specialized training for law enforcement agencies, interagency partners and National Guard Counterdrug personnel.

Federal Operations

Provide mobile radar, Airborne Reconnaissance Signals Intelligence, Language, Transcription, linguistics, criminal analysis, and air surveillance support for counternarcotics and counternarcoterrorism through the Mobile Air Surveillance System, Senior Scout, Host Nation Rider, Transcription Translation Support System, Ringgold, Conus Federal Law Enforcement Support, and Joint Interagency task Force South Programs.

Substance Abuse/Prevention, Treatment, Outreach

Conducts evidence-based prevention education; refers servicemembers to local prevention and treatment services, conducts outreach activities for family members and community partners. Provides peer supported "Soldier Care."
