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Executive Summary

This guide provides only a short summary and analysis of the many National Guard-related provisions in the Defense Appropriations bill. To obtain a complete understanding of any particular provision, users are encouraged to review the actual legislative language contained in the applicable section of the law. The bill is available on the NGB-LL web page at HTTP://WWW.NG.MIL/LL/

Current Status: On 19 December, the President signed H.R. 3326, the Fiscal Year 2010 Defense Appropriations Act. Although not a conference report, the explanatory statement is structured like a conference report.

Key Provisions: The bill includes **\$575 million** for the Army National Guard and **\$135 million** for the Air National Guard in NGREA funding. This robust funding will constitute a significant strengthening of the National Guard's equipment fill and modernization efforts.

The Army and Air National Guard Personnel accounts are funded <u>below</u> the President's request but not as drastically as the rescissions in the House and Senate bills. The Army and Air National Guard Operations and Maintenance accounts are also funded <u>below</u> the President's request. The bill restores full funding for the Army National Guard Recruiting and Advertising account which had been decremented \$95 million by the Senate. Recruiting highly educated soldiers requires more sophisticated and costly outreach efforts so these funds are needed in order to attract the highest quality members to serve in the National Guard during demanding times.

The bill also provides **\$50 million** for state specific National Guard counter-drug programs as well as an additional **\$15 million** to sustain current levels of staffing for High Priority National Guard Counterdrug Programs. This continues the elevated funding for National Guard state plans nationwide which Congress has provided in recent years. Without these additional funds, National Guard members in several states will have to be removed from duties supporting law enforcement and drug demand reduction efforts.

The bill also retains a provision offered by Senator Sanders (I-VT) during Senate consideration that provides an additional **\$20 million** for Yellow Ribbon Reintegration and Outreach programs.

Of note, the bill requires the Air Force to submit to the Appropriations Committees a report on Combat Air Force restructuring required by the Fiscal Year 2010 NDAA. The bill noted Congress' concern over the lack of detail and analysis regarding the plan to retire 248 legacy F-15, F-16, and A-10 aircraft. The bill also requires a report on the firefighting capabilities of Air Force, Air Force Reserve, and Air National Guard C-130 aircraft to support the United States Forest Service.

The bill also retains funding for LAIRCM kits for the Air National Guard taken out of the \$368.8 million in funding for the procurement of F-22 aircraft. Also of interest is funding for E-8C JSTARS aircraft re-engining. While the House bill fully funded the President's request for E-8C JSTARS the Senate provided no funding for JSTARS from the Aircraft Procurement, Air Force account. The bill provides **\$75 million** in Aircraft Procurement, Air Force and **\$115.9 million** in Air Force Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation for E-8C JSTARS re-engining.

The Committee directs that the National Guard and Reserve Equipment program shall be executed by the heads of the Guard and Reserve components with priority consideration given to the following items: AB-FIST Gunnery Trainer Upgrades; Active Noise Cancellations Systems for ANG C-130; ANG Block 42 F-16 Engine Upgrade; ARC 210 Radios for ANG F-16s; Combined Arms Virtual Trainers; Communications Aerial Platforms; Domestic Response Equipment; EST 200; F-15C AESA Radar for ANG; Family of Medium Tactical Vehicles; Flextrain Exportable Combat Training Capability; High Mobility Multipurpose Wheeled Vehicles; HMMWV Egress Assistance Trainers; KC-135 Aeromedical Evacuation Upgrades; Large Aircraft Infrared Countermeasures for C-17; Large Aircraft Infrared Countermeasures for C-130; LITENING 4th General Kit Upgrades for APR; MRAP Vehicle Virtual Trainers; NP 2000 Propeller System for ANG 130s; TJH-27A Security and Support Mission Equipment upgrades; UH-60A to L conversions; Virtual Convoy Operations Trainers; Virtual Door Gunner Trainers; Virtual Interactive Combat Environment; and Wideband Imagery Dissemination System.

Joint Programs

Youth Challenge – The compromise bill includes **\$110.8** million for the National Guard Youth Challenge Program, which is **\$15** million above the President's request of \$95.8 million.

STARBASE - The compromise bill fully fund the President's request of \$16.4 million for STARBASE.

Yellow Ribbon – The compromise bill includes an additional **\$20 million** for Yellow Ribbon Reintegration and Outreach programs

Counter-Drug – The compromise bill includes **\$1.1 billion** for Drug Interdiction and Counter-Drug activities, Defense-wide. The compromise bill fully funds the request of **\$166.5 million** for National Guard State Plans that support domestic law enforcement efforts and counter-narcoterrorism schools. The compromise bill also includes an additional **\$15 million** for High Priority National Guard Counterdrug Programs, and **\$50 million** for the state-specific programs listed below.
