

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Requirements for <u>commissioned officers</u> to be educated and experienced in joint matters was codified as part of the Goldwater-Nichols Act of 1986. The JQS builds upon this historic legislation by providing a structure that recognizes the expeditionary and inherently joint nature of how military forces operate in the 21st century

Purpose: Establishing such qualification levels is to ensure a systematic, progressive, career-long development of officers in joint matters and to ensure that Flag and General officers have the requisite experience and education to be highly proficient in joint matters

CNGBI 1704.01 Dated 19 October 2016 states:

By 1 October 2020, only <u>officers</u> with <u>significant joint experience\*</u>, will be nominated or appointed to National Guard <u>General Officer T10</u> assignments

\*Significant joint experience is completion of JPME II and 12 joint experience points.





- New DODI Effective: April 3, 2018
- Designate officers on the <u>Active Duty List (ADL)</u> as Level III JQO before appointment to Brigadier General or Rear Admiral (lower half), pursuant to Section 619a of Title 10, U.S.C. (Does not apply to NG)
- May be designated Level IV without being designated as Level III. This typically applies to RC GO/FOs who have not had the opportunity to complete JPME II requirements before promotion to O-7 or for a GO/FO who may have received a scientific and technical or professional waiver of the JQO requirement for promotion to O-7. GO/FOs designated as Level IV without being designated as Level III are not eligible to fill critical JDA billets unless the CJCS approves a waiver.







All officers appointed to the positions listed below have met the requirements for JQO Level IV designation. The CJCS will determine whether officers nominated for appointment to the following positions have significant joint duty experience, including providing an evaluation of that officer's performance as a member of the Joint Staff and in other JDAs through the Secretary of Defense to the President:

- (1) Chief of the National Guard Bureau
- (2) Chief of Army Reserve
- (3) Chief of Navy Reserve
- (4) Commander, Marine Forces Reserve
- (5) Chief of Air Force Reserve
- (6) Vice Chief of the National Guard Bureau
- (7) Director, Army National Guard
- (8) Director, Air National Guard

## GO's Self-Nomination Experience Package





Must be submitted within 12 months of completing the experience.

**TAG's** can Self-Nominate after being in the position for 24 months. Because of the varied duties and missions of state The Adjutant General positions, officers must apply for E-JDA in order to receive JDA credit (DoDI 1300.19).



## Joint Matters Definition



### Joint Matters as defined in 10 USC § 668:

Matters related to the development or achievement of strategic objectives through the synchronization, coordination, and organization of integrated forces in operations across domains such as land, sea, or air, in space, or in the information environment, including matters relating to:

### What You do: Sets apart "Joint" Experiences from "Joint Matters" Experiences

- 1. National Military Strategy
- 2. Strategic Planning and Contingency Planning
- 3. Command and Control intelligence, fires, movement and maneuver, protection or sustainment of operations under unified command
- 4. National Security Planning with Other US Departments/Agencies
- 5. Combined Operations with Military Forces of Allied Nations

### Who You Work With: Establishes a "Joint" Experience

Integrated Military Forces: planning and/or execution of ops involving:

- 1. More Than One Military Department; or
- 2. A Military Department and One or More of the Following:




