
- Primary purpose is to educationally develop officers for the intellectual demands of complex contingencies and conflict.

Joint Education





- Officer Basic Course (OBC) & Squadron Officer School (SOS) & Joint Professional Military Education (JPME) I
 - Check to ensure dates have been entered
 - Contact JOM Reps if dates are missing e-mail necessary proof of Education for the individual(s)
 - 1059s
 - RIP
 - Advanced Operations Course (AOC)
 - Air Command and Staff College (ACSC)





- Joint Professional Military Education (JPME) II
 - In-residence SDE
 - Joint and Combined Warfighting School (JCWS) inresidence or hybrid

Selection & Reports





- Selection process mainly refers to JCWS (in-residence and hybrid)
 - Competitive process now that several states have State JDAL positions approved
 - (38) ANG members selected for JCWS in 2018 and (28) had zero Joint Experience points
- In order to remain competitive, members' JOH reports need to remain current with their level of PME completed
 - ARNG & ANG both require members' to submit a copy of their JOH report when applying for JCWS
