- Michigan National Guard's Camp Grayling has been net-zero for water usage and waste water production for more than 20 years.
- Environmental stewardship best practices are shared with State Partnership Program partner countries like El Salvador and Honduras.
- "No heat, no cool" weeks in the Nevada Air National Guard reduced energy usage by 36% in 2014.
- West Virginia and Florida Army National Guard took top honors in the 2016 Secretary of the Army Environmental Awards.
- Guard members completed 9,320 training hours in working on or building environmental projects.


