



In fact, for many years I handled the vast majority of defense attorney representations for Soldiers facing substance abuse boards. Brown issues fuller National Guard records

WASHINGTON - The Massachusetts National Guard placed Scott Brown in retirement for nearly half a year in 2005 but reinstated, retroactively promoted him, and awarded back pay after he filed an appeal to correct his record, according to a more complete version of his military file that the Republican senator released yesterday.

Brown took the step as he seeks to keep his US Senate seat in the face of a challenge by former Harvard law professor Elizabeth Warren.

Brown, despite a stellar record, had been passed over twice for promotion from major to lieutenant colonel in 2004 because he had not completed a required officer course, the records show in the most detailed account yet on an episode that had been reported.

When he graduated from the course in May 2005, the National Guard had moved to place him in a retired status, and he was notified he was no longer in the Guard a month later.

Brown filed an appeal to show that he had completed the Command and General Staff College based at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., and was informed in December 2005 he could rejoin the ranks

A year later he was made a lieutenant colonel, a promotion retroactive to July 2005.

Brown released a more complete version of his military personnel file yesterday after the National Guard provided the Globe a heavily redacted record Friday in response to a Freedom of Information Act request.

In a press release, Brown's office sought to put to rest unsubstantiated rumors swirling for years that he might have sought a transfer to avoid combat.

In his 2011 memoir, Brown said he was fully prepared to be deployed overseas. His file shows that all his assignments were initiated by the National Guard.

"Senator Brown has never requested a transfer," the press release stated.

Meanwhile, the records shed more light on why Brown had been relieved of his Guard duties in the middle of 2005.

"You were considered but, unfortunately, were not among those selected for promotion by the board," stated a Feb. 19, 2004, memo to Brown. "The records reviewed by the Department of the Army Selection Board did not indicate that you had completed the required civilian and/or military education by the day the board convened."

The education in question, his office said yesterday, was the Fort Leavenworth officer course.

Brown completed the course the following May. But it was apparently not in time to alert Guard headquarters because they informed him in June he was being retired.

Though the records do not reflect it, Brown's office said he filed an appeal.

"Senator Brown's board file was missing a document that showed he had completed the Command and General Staff Officer Course," his office said. "This was an administrative oversight."

Brown was not available last night to answer questions. His communications director, Marcie Kinzel, said Brown was told at the time he was being retired because he was still not eligible for promotion without the officer course - even though he had completed it the month before. "He fought it because he wanted to stay in uniform," she said.

Part of the reason it took so long for the part-time major to graduate from the college was because it included a series of seminars over three years, she said.

In the portions that had been withheld for privacy reasons, superiors describe Brown as possessing the "highest character attributes" and "unlimited potential" during the period he was held back as a major.

"Major Brown possesses excellent skills and expertise in legislative matters," states one performance evaluation dated Nov. 1, 2004. "His talents are directly transferable to situations requiring diplomacy and/or interaction with civil authorities."

The file released Friday, covering Brown's 32-year career as a part-time military officer and lawyer, had performance evaluations and other records withheld by the government to protect his privacy. The file released by Brown's office did not include details of documents on security clearances and life insurance. His office said he is requesting medical records and will release them.

BOSTON - Republican U.S. Sen. Scott Brown on Saturday released a copy of his military record, after a Freedom of Information request by the Boston Globe was honored with a heavily redacted version of the document.

"On January 24, 2012, the senator was informed by the Department of Defense that requests for his military record had been made under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), and the record would be released on January 27, 2012," Brown's Washington office said in a statement. "In accordance with protocol, DoD shared with the senator a copy of the records that would be released. Upon seeing that the records were heavily redacted, Senator Brown decided to go beyond what was required and release a copy of the record that is open and transparent."

A full copy of the records can be viewed at the bottom of this post.

Brown, who is in the middle of a heated reelection campaign against three Democratic challengers, including consumer advocate Elizabeth Warren, said that he is proud of his military record.

"I am proud of my 32 years of service in the Army National Guard," Brown said in a statement. "The Guard has profoundly impacted my life, and I credit those I have served with for inspiring me to be a better man, and a better servant of my country."

His office said the blacked out portions of the document it released on Saturday referred to his life insurance policy and medical records.

BOSTON – U.S. Sen. Scott Brown released his military service record Saturday documenting the more than three decades he has served in the Army National Guard.

The records include his promotions, awards and officer evaluation reports, which offer high praise of Brown's service during the Massachusetts Republican's years in the military.

An officer evaluation report from 1985 was typical, describing Brown as "a young and aggressive officer."

"He is self-motivated and learns very fast. He has the potential to be promoted to a position with greater responsibilities," the report said.

Brown, a member of the Armed Services Committee, is facing a tough re-election campaign.

His office said the documents show the reason he was passed up for a Guard promotion to lieutenant colonel in the Judge Advocate General Corps in 2003 and 2004 was due to a missing document in his file.

Brown's office described the failure to include the document — which showed that he had completed the necessary Command and General Staff Office Course — as an administrative oversight. They noted that after Brown appealed to show that he had completed the required military education, he received the promotion in 2006.

The same oversight caused the Army National Guard to place Brown into the Retired Reserve from July 2005 through December 2005, his office said.

Brown first enlisted in the Massachusetts Army National Guard in 1979.

"I am proud of my 32 years of service in the Army National Guard," he said in a statement accompanying the documents. "The Guard has profoundly impacted my life, and I credit those I have served with for inspiring me to be a better man, and a better servant of my country."

The documents did not include Brown's military medical records, which he said he plans to release when the military provides a copy.

Brown's office said he has never requested a transfer during his military service and that every transfer he received was ordered by the Massachusetts National Guard Adjutant General.

The awards Brown received include a Meritorious Service Medal, an Army Commendation Medal, an Army Achievement Medal and Army Parachutist Badge.

Brown, who also serves on the Senate Homeland Security and Veterans Affairs committees, has said his service in the military has helped inform his work as an elected official.

He pointed to a recent proposal he sponsored that he said was designed to protect housing benefits for National Guard members deployed overseas.

Brown recently hosted a field hearing of the U.S. Senate Committee of Veterans Affairs to address what he said was the unprecedented claims backlog at the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the difficulty that returning veterans face as they try to enter to the workforce.

Last August, Brown participated in a weeklong training session in Afghanistan, spending most of his time in Kabul, where he lived, ate and trained with other troops, according to his office. It was his first time serving in a combat zone.

He was a key vote to end the so-called "don't ask, don't tell" policy that had prevented gay soldiers from serving openly in the military.

Brown won a special election in 2010 to fill the seat held for nearly half a century by Democratic Sen. Edward Kennedy until his death from brain cancer.

His chief Democratic rival this year is Harvard professor and consumer advocate Elizabeth Warren. Polls show the two locked in a tight race.

The two recently signed an agreement designed to discourage outside, third-party groups from running attack ads in the race, which could end up being the most expensive campaign in Massachusetts history
